Dr. Alexei Botchkarev is an information and knowledge management professional, consultant and researcher. He has over 30 years of experience in project management, systems analysis, modelling and simulation, business processes analysis, information systems solutions, requirements analysis and scientific research.

Alex holds a Bachelor's degree in Electronic Engineering from the Kiev Aviation Engineering Academy, Ukraine, and Ph.D. from the aerospace R&D Institute.
